
Here are some of our heartwarming stories this year...

Several months ago, we were alerted to a situation where a beautiful pittie boy named Bronx had found himself homeless after his mom sadly and unexpectedly passed away due to a domestic violence situation. His human brothers and sisters were completely devastated but there was no possible way for them to keep him. He was such a loving, loyal, and all-around good boy who absolutely adored all his walks and snuggles.

We were desperate to find him a home where he could recover from his previous trauma and learn to love another family just as he had done with his mom and human siblings. He spent a very long time in boarding and continued to be passed over for adoption. He was a volunteer favorite and we worked tirelessly to work on his manners and behavior training to make sure he was ready to be adopted. One day we received an application from a family who had recently lost their amazing pittie and found themselves heartbroken. They were in search of a rescue dog to call their own. After meeting Bronx, it was love at first sight and they knew they had found the one. Bronx deserved nothing but the best and he finally had found his new forever family.

### Rocky

At the very beginning of 2022 we learned about an adult cat that was dumped at a local veterinary office after his owner could no longer care for him. He was transferred to a shelter who reached out to us to see if we could help. Poor Rocky was dumped with a severely enlarged eye that needed to be removed immediately. After his eye removal he was happy as could be and was officially ready for adoption. We had a very nice young couple who completed an application for him and were smitten when they got to meet him. After he was adopted, we were all happy and excited for Rocky. Sadly, three weeks later his adoptive family reached out because he was having labored breathing and stopped eating. After a couple emergency visits it was determined that Rocky had FIP which is usually an incurable disease that typically results in euthanasia. There is a treatment that is not currently approved in the United States so we had to jump through hoops to find a group that could help us get the medicine.

Rocky deserved a shot at a normal life, and we were going to do what we could to help him. His treatment was extremely expensive and consisted of 84 days of injections and 84 days of observation. We could not expect his adoptive family to take on this process or the stress that came with it. Rocky was temporarily placed back with his foster mom who completed his treatment. After that he was placed back with his adoptive family for the 84 days of observation. We are so happy to announce that as of now, Rocky's treatment was successful and is currently living his best life with his family.

### Jules

A few months ago, we learned of a beautiful little girl named Jules who had been taken to a local New Jersey shelter. She was completely shut down and scared of everyone and everything. We had considered rescuing her, but another rescue stepped up first. A few weeks later that rescue reached out to us asking for help. They realized that she needed more work than they had the time and resources for to do what was best for her. We stepped in and she was immediately placed in an experienced foster home.

We quickly learned that she had been severely abused and neglected. She trusted no one and would not move from her bed or crate. She had to be leashed at all times so she could be taken outside for walks and bathroom time. Her foster mom worked tirelessly with her using high value treats and toys to help teach her that humans could be loving. In the last two months Jules has been learning so much and has started to trust and engage with new humans. Jules is up for adoption and would do best in a dog savvy adult only home where there is little commotion and visitors are limited. Once she warms up, she will be your best friend. She does need to be the only pet and does not do well when crated. She is great in the car, loves to sleep with her humans, is pee pad and potty trained and loves her walks or yard time.



### Babs

Several months ago, we rescued this shy little two-year-old, muted calico from a local Northern New Jersey town thanks in part to a trapper that we work with quite frequently. We named her Babs after her trapper.

She had obviously been someone's cat at some point because she was not feral, just scared. We scanned her for a microchip, but unfortunately, she was not chipped or spayed. We immediately got her all the necessary veterinary care and after her FeLV/ FIV (Feline Leukemia/ Feline Aids) test was complete, it was determined that she was FIV positive. There are many misconceptions about how long FIV cats live or if they can live with other cats.

Babs is currently in an amazing foster home living with a dog, cats and two other FIV cats. Most people who own FIV cats own non-FIV cats as well. They can live normal happy and healthy lives and are some of the friendliest cats around. Babs has settled in nicely and absolutely loves to run around, play with her toys and of course nap on her favorite cat tree. She is an extreme cuddler and will always choose a human's lap over a cat bed. She would do great in a home with other playful cats or kittens. We currently have six FIV positive cats up for adoption. If you have ever wondered about adopting an FIV cat, there is a lot of information and research on the web. It is truly amazing how wonderful these cats can be.
