Lucy & Ethel

Lucy and Ethel are two of the most inspiring dogs we rescued and rehabilitated in 2023. These poor girls were found emaciated and literally hours from death. One of our rescue partners was alerted to the situation and we quickly stepped in to help. They were found in Newark and unfortunately none of our volunteers were available to get them and take them to the vet. We called Summit Dog and Cat Hospital to ask if they had two spots to treat and board them. They of course agreed and two of their employees even stepped up to go to Newark and grab Lucy and Ethel. We were so grateful for their generosity. They immediately started to receive treatment. Lucy weighed next to nothing and could barely stand. Ethel was also very thin but at least had a little more life to her. It was touch and go for a few days while the vets worked tirelessly to get them IV nutrition and antibiotics. Slowly both girls started to improve and every day was a new milestone. Standing, sitting, tail wagging, eating a normal meal were all celebrated. After two weeks in the hospital they were finally able to go into a foster home. While in foster they flourished into amazing little dogs. Lucy was the firecracker of the two, chasing other dogs around, playing with toys and creating fun chaos wherever she went. Ethel was more

low-key. She liked to sleep in her favorite dog bed or play fun police while Lucy and the other dogs were playing. Soon it was time for them to go up for adoption. Lucy was adopted first into a home with another wonderful little dog. She has definitely taken over the house but is learning every day how to be the best girl she can be. Ethel got adopted shortly after and is with an amazing couple where she is the queen of her castle, goes on walks with the neighborhood dogs and gets to sleep in her parents bed every night. We are eternally grateful to everyone involved in Lucy and Ethel's journey.





Nosey's story is one we see all too often in the rescue community... but his journey is one for the story books. He was found outside by a Good Samaritan. He was cold, hungry and suffering from a horrific leg injury. The family didn't know what to do so they took him to Plainfield Animal Hospital to see if they could help. They didn't have the money to pay for his treatment, so Dr. Alex stepped up to do most of the work herself and paid for his bloodwork and other treatment. He was at the hospital for three weeks while his leg wound was treated. He quickly became a favorite of the staff and they were desperate to find him placement. Although his leg was healing, he soon had another setback. When his bloodwork came back, he had tested positive for Feline Aids (FIV). Although it was not a death sentence, it did make it harder to find him rescue placement. Dr. Alex had reached out to ten different rescue groups who could not take him in. Then she finally reached out to our Director of Cat Adoptions and of course we decided to help. Nosey was finally healed enough, had been neutered, vaccinated, microchipped and was ready to go into his new foster home. He spent about five months in foster before we received an amazing



application from a young lady who had grown up with FIV positive cats and now living on her own, was ready to adopt. It was love at first sight and Nosey was adopted into a loving home. At the time we didn't know if he was cat friendly because of his injuries we didn't want to take the chance to introduce him to other cats. Well, we are happy to report that his adoptive mom rescued another FIV positive cat and now they are living the dream as brothers and best friends. We are so thankful to Dr. Alex and Nosey's finders for making his new life possible.



Karma


Available for Adoption!




Our Community of Volunteers
